Definitions

Civilian Labor Force

This is the sum of employment and unemployment, based on unrounded data. It comprises civilians 16 years of age and over who are working or seeking work. It excludes military personnel, persons in institutions, those studying or keeping house full-time, persons who are retired or unable to work, and volunteer workers.

Employment

This represents all persons employed in the reference week, whether in agricultural or nonagricultural industries; whether part-time or full-time; and whether payroll workers, self-employed persons, unpaid workers in family enterprises, or domestics. Those temporarily absent from their jobs for reasons such as illness, vacation, or labor-management disputes are also counted as employed. Those who hold more than one job, however, are counted only once.

Unemployment

This represents persons who were not employed during the reference week, but who were actively seeking work, waiting to be called back to a job from which laid off, or waiting to report within 30 days to a new payroll job.
